About Autism Canada

Autism Canada is the only Canadian organization with a national perspective on the issues currently facing those with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), their families, caregivers, and other allies.

Autism Canada has been generating public awareness about autism in Canada since 1976. Together, with our counterparts, we work to share expertise, build consensus and inform public policy. In addition to encouraging best practices, we actively promote national dialogue on the most effective strategies for building equitable access to funding and services.

Every one of our staff and Board of Directors has a personal connection to autism and neurodiversity or are on the Autism Spectrum themselves. Additionally, Autism Canada is guided by an external advisory group called "Autism Ambassadors" made up entirely of individuals on the spectrum. The Autism Ambassadors are a consistent and direct connection to the autism community in Canada and act as our consultants on issues relevant to the autism community.

Our strategic objectives focus on changing the future for those on the Autism Spectrum through the delivery of the highest quality programs like the national annual Au-Some Conference, written and presented solely by those on the Autism Spectrum. We are home to the first of its kind Search and Rescue for Autism program as well as the Recognizing Behaviours and Sensory Support programs. Additionally, Autism Canada hosts the Family Services Program which allows us to provide practical and timely support to individuals and families in need.

Autism Society Canada Treasurer's Report

In 2021 Autism Society Canada experienced a 4% increase in revenue over 2020; total revenue was \$632,775. The organization's revenue from donations was \$317,821 which was a 58% increase in donations from last year. This included a legacy gift of \$50,000. Sincere thanks to all of our donors who continue to provide financial support to the organization.

Salary and wage adjustments accounted for most of a 5% increase in expenditures, and the year ended with a modest surplus of \$132.433, comparable to the 2020 surplus of \$130,671.

Autism Society Canada received a qualified audit opinion for 2021; this is because the organization receives revenue through fundraising initiatives and donations which are not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. This is common amongst charities that conduct fundraising.

Lastly, I'd like to express my appreciation to the members of the finance and audit committee of the board who are responsible for ensuring that Autism Canada has its financial affairs and internal controls in order.



Our strength is our Family Services Program

Autism Canada's Family Services Program has been operational for over a decade and serves as our front-line connection to individuals and families in need. Our dedicated staff and volunteers receive and respond to thousands of inquiries annually, providing resources, referrals, services, and crisis support to those struggling with an autism diagnosis and potential co-occurring conditions.

Each inquiry is researched and responded to with available resources by province or community. This can include employment, education, diagnosis, housing, and funding according to location and nature of severity. With the global pandemic and the simultaneous suspension or elimination of essential support programs, uncertainties within school networks, job loss, homelessness, and severe mental health concerns, crisis inquiries have become increasingly common.

The Family Service team at Autism Canada is trained to provide the support necessary for the crisis situations some on the Autism Spectrum may be facing.



Our free, annual Au-Some Conference was a successful day of presentations about autism created and shared by autistics. This year, because of our supporters, we were able to compensate all of our presenters with an honorarium for their time and efforts. We were able to secure Canadian icon & autism advocate Eugene Levy to introduce the conference and as well as our keynote speaker!

By far our largest event, the Au-Some Conference is virtual and free so attendees can view from anywhere in Canada (and beyond). To date, & since its launch on October 23, the engaging presentations from the Au-Some Conference have been viewed over 3,000 times.

The Speaker Series

2021 saw the launch of a new forum for community events, The Speaker Series.

We organized 3 free events for our community to share information and learnings about autism from subject experts and autistics alike.

The series included presentations on sleep strategies and relaxation / meditation for children on the spectrum, the importance of human connection for autistics and a three part series on back to school for parents and caregivers.





Community events are an important way to engage, spread acceptance and create inclusivity for autistics, their caregivers, friends, and allies. With the isolation created by the pandemic through 2020 and 2021, we wanted to bring people together for community and for some much needed fun.

We hosted 3 Musical BINGO events which saw community members join us online to play bingo by searching for songs and artists instead of numbers.

We also hosted the Canadian premiere of the movie The Limits of My World, a documentary film about a young man aging out of the system and about his relationship with his neurotypical sister.

Between these events, we engaged over 270 people and raised over \$7,000 to support our Family Services Team's activity.
