## FOR RESIDENTIAL AND HOUSING

Given that 1 in 50 people in Canada is diagnosed on the Autism Spectrum, it is crucial to enhance understanding of autism, particularly among those involved in residential properties and construction where interactions with individuals on the spectrum may occur in potentially overwhelming and emotional situations.

Requests for accommodations in residential settings, such as allowing a service animal in a pet-free apartment building or adapting kitchen accessibility, are often specific to the unique needs of tenants. Individuals might find it challenging to articulate these needs independently, emphasizing the importance of acknowledging their right to request accommodations. Equally significant is the need to educate those engaged in the day-to-day affairs of tenants about social awareness and the creation of safe and accessible spaces for individuals on the spectrum.
